Generic Name:	Prochlorperazine
Purpose:	This medicine is used to control severe nausea and vomiting.
Usage:	If the suppository is too soft to insert, chill it in the refrigerator for 30 minutes or run cold water over it before removing the foil. Remove the foil wrapper and moisten suppository with cold water. Lie down on your side and use your finger to push the suppository well up into rectum.
Precautions:	This medicine will add to the effects of alcohol and other depressants (medicines that slow down the nervous system). Drowsiness or blurred vision may occur. Do not drive or do any job that requires you to be alert and to see clearly.
Possible Side Effects:	
	Common side effects that may go away during treatment include constipation, decreased sweating, dizziness, drowsiness, dry mouth, or stuffy nose. If they continue or are bothersome, check with Dr. Beeson. Also check with Dr. Beeson as soon as possible if you experience blurred vision or difficulty seeing at night, difficulty in talking or swallowing, fainting, inability to move eyes, lip muscle spasms of face, neck or back, puffing of cheeks, restlessness, shuffling walk or stiff arms and legs, tic-like twitching or twisting movements, trembling of hands, uncontrolled chewing or tongue movements, or uncontrolled movements of arms and legs.
